Health Advocates' 2023 New York Treasures

Kathy Hoffman Linburn has lived in New York City for most of her life, where she worked in real estate for over 30 years. She became known as one of New York City's premier townhouse brokers. Her book, *Why Not a Townhouse?* is used by prospective purchasers and owners alike as a guide to buying, selling and living in a New York City Townhouse. She currently serves on the Board of Directors for Search and Care, The Clarion Music Society, and The Beekman Place Association. Horticulture and gardens are a passion, and she is active in the City Gardens Club. Kathy and her late husband Michael have been longtime active members of The Church of the Incarnation, where she is currently a member of The Vestry.

Eva-Maria Frank Tausig was born and raised in New York City. She received a BA in modern European history and German literature at the University of Michigan and she later studied linguistics at Columbia University. Eva and her husband Hans married in New York City where they proudly raised their four children. She joined the National Dance Institute board in the late 1970s and is currently the longest serving board member. Her passion for the arts was further fulfilled as a co-founder of both the Nantucket Community Music Center and the Nantucket Lightship Basket Museum. She has served as President of the Nantucket Musical Arts Society since 1977. A prolific fiber artist, Eva has donated over 1,000 original, handmade baby blankets, hats and; scarves to Florida, Texas and most recently to Ukraine. Eva's love for the arts, music and children complimented her commitment to supporting healthy communities. She discovered a shared passion for the NY Foundation for Elder Care through her father, one of the founders in the 1930's.

The Reverend Canon Carl F. Turner became XIII Rector of Saint Thomas Church Fifth Avenue in July 2014. With its world-famous choir of men and boys, the Saint Thomas Choir School is one of only three where the choristers live on site. Canon Turner is Chaplain to the St. George's Society of New York and is a member of the Venerable Order of St. John of Jerusalem. The Knights of Malta, St. Patrick's Cathedral, Fifth Avenue Presbyterian Church, Saint Thomas collectively provide social workers and a chaplain for the homeless. He received the Malta Cross and is a member of the Board of the U.S. Friends of Canterbury Cathedral. Prior to his time in Exeter, Canon Turner served two curacies, was Precentor of Exeter Cathedral with its 850-year-old Choir School, was a member of the Church of England's General Synod, and a Director of the Association of English Cathedrals. Canon Turner served at Essex at Leigh-on-Sea and Brentwood then later Rector of the Divine Compassion, in the East End of London. Carl was born in Yorkshire; he studied at Durham University and completed his studies at Oxford University. Carl and his wife Alison have three adopted children, three grandchildren, and a Cairn Terrier called Bertie.
